## ***Gospel Reflection: Palm Sunday***

Readings: 2Cor 10:1-7 and Mk 10:46-52

Today, Christ, our King enters into Jerusalem with the shouts of Hosanna, “save us, we pray.” It was this king who has come to save us and liberate us from the slavery of sin and to grant us everlasting life. This is a king who knows his kingdom and who sees the lost and hopeless condition of His people. He is a king who helps in time of need. He is a king who is our hope. He is the king who came to make peace between God and humanity, between earth and heaven.

Let us pray today, that the Lord of peace and life may grant us the purity of the hearts of the children who welcomed him into Jerusalem, so that we may welcome him each day as he comes to establish peace in our hearts, among our families and in our world.

Christ’s presence makes us always shout for joy and be happy.

With this spirit of Hosanna, let us enter into this Great Holy Week, which brings us into the heart of the mystery of our salvation. This week is the time to renew our loyalty to the king who went all the way for love of every one of us.

Let us walk with him this holiest week, to sit down with Him at the Eucharistic Supper, to have our feet and souls washed through his grace, to walk with Him the way of the Cross, to experience the depth of His love toward us which he manifested on the cross, and to celebrate His glorious Resurrection, the pledge of our eternal life.

Today, let us join our voices to those of the children of Jerusalem and ask the Lord our God to save us and liberate us from sin and death. To him be glory, praise and exaltation now and forever.
