## ***14<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Pentecost***

Readings: 1Thes 2:1-13 and Lk 10:38-42

I cannot remember his name but I will not forget his story. It was 1941 and the world was preparing for an immense war. But this man's world was quite small by comparison and appeared to be near its end, as a prisoner in the concentration camp known as Auschwitz. There had been an escape in the night and so in retaliation the Nazi commander of the camp randomly chose 10 innocent prisoners to be executed. This man was unfortunate enough to be among those chosen and he desperately begged for his life for the sake of his family. Suddenly an unassuming figure stepped forward from the ranks of prisoners and asked that he be taken in place of the man. The exchange was accepted and Maximilian Koble suffered starvation and death for the sake of his fellow prisoner. This Jewish prisoner survived Auschwitz and lived nearly 50 years more, a family man to the end. But what touched me most about this man telling his story was his final comment: "I will never forget what that man did for me. And I have never let a day pass without praising God for the gift I was given and telling the world what he has done for me."

St. Maximilian Kolbe's feast day is celebrated on the day immediately preceding the feast of the Assumption: August 14th. How appropriate, given his strong devotion to our Blessed Mother and the manner in which his life was so like her own in service of God and humanity.

Like the Jewish survivor who wished to let the world know what had been done for him, Mary proclaims with her words and her life what God has done for her and His people. Her canticle (The Magnificat) reflects her own humility and recognition that the good which she experiences in her life is a gift from God. Mary exemplifies par excellence the posture each of us should have before the Almighty, who has shown Himself over and over to have regard for his faithful servants and to be faithful to His promises. So often God chooses the unexpected: the weak to be strong, the insignificant to rule, the last to be first, the virgin to be fruitful, and the humble to be exalted.

From the worldly perspective, Mary was a most unlikely choice to be the Mother of God, but in the divine plan it makes all the sense in the world. For God reverses the priorities and order imposed by fallen man and thereby demonstrates the power of His grace and goodness at work in a fallen world.

On the feast of the Assumption, the Church celebrates the realization of the promise of the resurrection in the person of Mary, who was assumed body and soul into heaven when her life came to an end in this world. As such, she is the first fruit from all humanity to experience the fullness of eternal life. As we continue our journey through this life in faith and look forward with hope to the heavenly life that Mary enjoys even now, let us do what we can to proclaim with our words and our lives the greatness of the Lord.

### ***From the Desk of the Pastor***

#### ***Msgr. Bakhos' Motto: "Say your word and walk away"***

Dear parishioners,

This year we had been fortunate to have a young committee to plan for the festival and its future. The financial report will be ready in mid-September when all the bills are received. I want to clarify something that is obscure in the minds of many concerning the Festival.

When the festival started 84 years ago, it was a "picnic" event. It means every family brings its own food and meet at Oglebay Park to enjoy the gathering and at the same time some local singing and dancing. There was no charge of any sort nor from Oglebay Park nor from any hired company.

Nowadays, the church has to invest upfront almost \$25,000.00 to run the festival. Wow! Some will say, "Fr., are you joking? This is a church and everything is supposed to be free?"

My friends, there is nothing free in our days. We are treated as any other business in town. I need you to add these expenses and judge for yourselves. These rounded numbers are approximately within range: Oglebay park fees: \$2,000, tents and tables: \$4,000, entertainment: \$3,500, licenses: \$1,000, pastry: \$2,000; drink: \$1000; advertisement: \$6,000; printing: \$1,000; security: \$1,000; general operation: \$6,000 and other expenses here and there.

As you can see, when parishioners and guests pitch their tents on the ground we rent and bring their own food and say to us, "we are here to entertain ourselves FREE." That is killing the festival right there because the church could not spent \$25,000.00 every year to entertain irresponsible people. Those who understand this truth and love the festival, must support the festival financially by buying food and drink and sponsoring this lovely tradition for the future generations. –Msgr. Bakhos

## ***Wisdom***

Fluorescent light bulbs contain a very small amount of mercury sealed within the glass tubing. The Environmental Protection Agency recommends the following cleanup and disposal guidelines:

- 1- Open a window and leave the room for 15 minutes or more.
- 2- Wearing disposable rubber gloves, carefully scoop up the fragments and powder with stiff paper or cardboard and place them in a plastic bag. Wipe the area clean with damp paper towels or disposable wet wipes and place them in the plastic bag, too. Seal the bag.
- 3- Do not use a vacuum or broom to clean up the broken bulb on hard surfaces.
- 4- Place all cleanup materials in a second sealed plastic bag. Take it to a recycling center or arrange for a recycler to pick it up. Wash your hands.
- 5- If a fluorescent bulb breaks on a rug or carpet:
  - a- First, remove all materials you can without using a vacuum cleaner, following the steps above. Sticky tape (such as duct tape) can be used to pick up small pieces and powder.
  - b- If vacuuming is needed after all visible materials are removed, vacuum the area where the bulb was broken, remove the vacuum bag (or empty and wipe the canister) and put the bag or vacuum debris in two sealed plastic bags in the outdoor trash or protected outdoor location for normal disposal.
