### All Souls Week Masses

Readings: 1Thess 5:1-11 and Lk 16:19-31

It's sometimes difficult in our hurried world to feel connected to those we know and love. How can we be expected to care about those we don't even know? Nonetheless, God calls us to care for all of our brothers and sisters whether they be friend or foe, near or far, rich or poor. "How?" you might ask. The ways are numerous. By praying. Through simple acts of kindness. By caring. By being informed. By learning about different cultures and ideas. By being open to unexpected opportunities to serve. By being concerned about events and happenings around us.

This week's message of unity is tied very closely to our call to discipleship. We are called in baptism to be one with each other. To love our neighbor as ourselves. To care, as Christ cares, for all people, especially the poor, the weak, those who have no power. We may find ourselves among the poor, weary, and powerless. When we do, we can look with hope and faithfulness to God: "Come to me all who are weary and I will give you rest."

Discipleship is not one-sided. At times we may be on the receiving end. We can look to our brothers and sisters in Christ for help, consolation, and support. We might look to our children for models of how to seek help. Youngsters are not hesitant to seek assistance: They need to be fed, clothed, cuddled, nurtured. But adults sometimes fear reaching out for help. We must be as little children, trusting and open, to enter God's reign. We need to be present for one another -to serve and to be served.

### From the Desk of The Pastor

Use of the Offering Envelopes My dear parishioners,

If you file every year for Tax deduction, you need to have offering envelopes in order that the financial committee records all your donations given inside the envelopes either cash or checks. Every offering envelope set has a serial number attributed to the giver. That's why you have no need to write your name or address on the Sunday envelope. Your donations are recorded under your number and at the end of the year, you receive a statement from the church detailing every donation by date, amount and check number. If you don't file for tax deduction, you do not need offering envelopes and your contributions are recorded only if they are put in an envelope labeled with your name. According to IRS regulations, only those who donated \$250.00 or more receive a church statement. Those who donated less than \$50.00 in 2018 are not given a 2019 envelope set and for any question, please call or see Msgr. Bakhos.
