Commemoration of the Righteous & Just

Readings: Heb 12:18-24 and Mt 25:31-46

Today's gospel focuses our attention on the connection between the last days and our own life, on our neighbor in relation to whom we shall be judged, on Christ the King who will preside over this tribunal. We must think clearly about the last days. Not to dream about heaven as the solution to all our problems — no, but to live as befits one who awaits the immense gathering of all mankind in the presence of the messianic Shepherd. Our final destiny is worked out in the smallest details of our present life.

In fact, we will be judged on how we behave today towards our neighbor; for the Son of Man is already mysteriously present in needy mankind. He dwells in our neighbor. First I must attend to the neighbor who lives next door, but there are also those countless multitudes “those millions of Christs, with dark and gentle eyes” (Fr Mauriac) who, in the highly interdependent world of today, expect something more than a few pence from me. They await a resourceful and effective love, which can set even the mechanics of political decisions in motion.

That rightly brings our thoughts to bear on Christ the universal King. This is not, however, with the idea of proclaiming his sovereignty over temporal affairs; in a society which is indeed pluralist and laicized this could not be done without ambiguity. Jesus used his title of king only for the hour when he comes in glory. But his hidden existence in the poor and the humble is just as real: he is the defender of their rights, their recognized protector. He it is whom we serve

when we serve the poor.

In the evening of life, ‘we will be judged on love’ (St John of the Cross); what we will be expected to render an account of at that judgment will be nothing else than the works of mercy, nothing else than the charity which does not pass away. And so we must love God and mankind to the end, but never God without man, and never man without God.
