Announcement to Zechariah

Readings: Gen 17:15-22; Rom 3:13-25 and Lk 1:1-25

The prophet Isaiah tells it thus: "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. The Spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord." (11:1-2).

Thoughts of Jesus fill our minds when we hear these beautiful words, for Jesus truly is descended from the root of Jesus and has been raised up as a sign to all generations of his kingship.

Many of us have Jesse trees in our churches or homes, onto or under which we remember others -often expectant parents- with prayers and gifts. The Old Testament told us about other special births, but even as we listen to stories about Samson and John the Baptizer, our minds are on the growing Christ-Child. Our time of waiting grows both short and heavy.

Will we be like the unnamed mother of Samson, who "did not ask (the man of God) where he came from" but was faithfully obeyed? Will we be like Zechariah, who "was terrified; and fear overshadowed him" so that he became speechless? Will we be like the psalmist, whose "mouth is filled with... praise... all day long?"

The 37th miracle of Jesus of the miraculous catsh of fish
